Message from VCHC Board Chair and Executive Director

This past year was another outstanding one for the Vaughan Community Health Centre (VCHC), as we focused on increasing access. In particular, we worked on addressing systemic gaps that prevent access to quality health and social services. To that end, we addressed language barriers, advocated on transportation issues, and helped non-insured newcomers to Ontario access quality health care while waiting to receive a health card.

Additional accomplishments over this past year include:

System Navigation Services. The VCHC was successful in its efforts to create a position---funded by the Ontario Trillium

Foundation---to help VCHC clients and residents of Vaughan navigate the Canadian health care and social systems. **Implementation of Advanced Access.** This new booking system guarantees that our clients obtain an appointment with their health care practitioner within 24 hours of their initial request.

Delivery of Physiotherapy Services for External Clients. At-risk Vaughan residents---who are not registered clinical clients of the VCHC, but who are nevertheless in need of affordable physiotherapy services---can now qualify for six physiotherapy sessions with an emphasis on self-management.

12 New Health Promotion Initiatives. The implementation of an additional 12 new well-received and well-utilized health promotion initiatives, to address issues such as isolation, lack of information, education, financial challenges, and the need to enhance life skills.

The board and staff of the Vaughan Community Health Centre are extremely proud of our role and reputation with the community at large as we continue to explore ways in which we can respond to the increasing demand for our services.

This year's outcomes are the result of a team effort. As usual the board, staff, volunteers and students worked tirelessly to ensure that our clients received the best care possible. Thanks to them, we will continue to move forward with our goal---a healthier community.

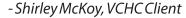

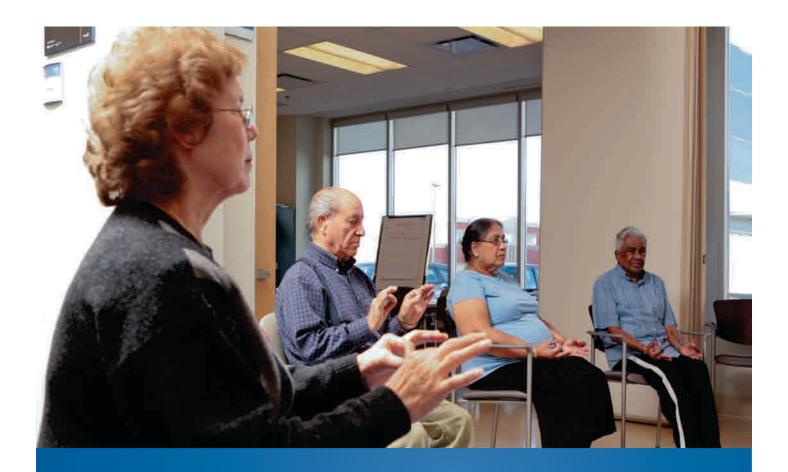

Implementing Advanced Access

As part of its commitment to quality improvement, the VCHC implemented Advanced Access, a clinical appointment booking system, that helps the VCHC better understand the needs of its clients and distribute available appointments throughout each

provider's daily schedule based on demand and supply. Advanced Access allows clients to see their health care provider without delay as every effort is made to provide appointments within 24 hours of the initial request. The utilization of Advanced Access has resulted in improved client access to care, office efficiency and client flow, as well as in an increase in client satisfaction, and an effective use of resources at VCHC.





VCHC'S Updated Website

The VCHC updated its website to make information regarding the Centre and its programs and services more user friendly and accessible. Its new design makes it easier and faster to access information. Stakeholders accessing the website for the first time may view the VCHC's introductory video which provides a comprehensive overview of the VCHC and its services. Features such as e-mail subscription to the VCHC's program calendar, easily increasing font size, and up to date information, allow any individual interested in VCHC's programs or services to access information quickly and efficiently.



Community Consultation

On July 7, 2011, the VCHC held a Community Consultation Event. The purpose of the event was to provide VCHC's clients and the Vaughan community at large with an opportunity to provide feedback and comments regarding the VCHC's past year's objectives and achievements. Information gathered at this event included the continued high demand for affordable physiotherapy services for residents of Vaughan, as well as the need to extend the VCHC's hours of operation. The VCHC welcomes all comments and suggestions and continues to respond to community feedback.



Responding to the Demand for Physiotherapy Services

In response to the Vaughan community's request for access to affordable physiotherapy services, the VCHC entered into a purchase of service agreement with four local physiotherapy clinics. Physiotherapy services were provided to vulnerable residents of Vaughan, who had barriers accessing physiotherapy services in their own local communities (i.e., Woodbridge, Thornhill, Maple). The affordable physiotherapy program specifically targeted Vaughan residents who are not registered VCHC clients. Individuals who met the eligibility criteria came to the VCHC to apply for the program and those approved were assigned to a physiotherapy facility closest to their home. The accepted applicants were given 6 free physiotherapy sessions that focused on self-management strategies. Through this innovative program, the VCHC was able to help over 230 Vaughan residents receive a limited number of free physiotherapy treatments.

Increasing Hours of Operation

In response to clients' requests, as of January 1, 2012, the VCHC extended its operating hours to include the delivery of services on Saturday mornings from 8:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m. These extended operating hours will further reduce barriers clients experience to accessing quality health care services. This initiative has been well received by our clients.

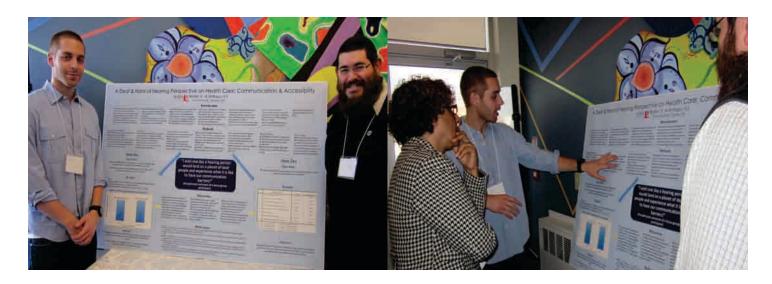

Language Interpretation Project

The purpose of this project was to survey the types and levels of language services currently available in three different organizations and recommend a decision framework that helps organizations identify the criteria to be used in their journey to find optimal solutions for language issues. The organizations' survey included one acute care facility: Mackenzie Health (formerly known as York Central Hospital), one primary care facility: the Vaughan Community Health Centre, and a settlement agency: the Vaughan Welcome Centre. In order to improve access for its own clients, the VCHC also recently purchased a video translation machine that can be used by service providers and clients during their appointments.

In the past year, the Diabetes Education Program has been actively present in the community. In particular, they have facilitated group sessions, blood sugar screenings and provided one-on-one counseling at several doctors' offices across York Region. In November 2011, the team held a health fair, which provided a central location for residents to obtain information about diabetes management and prevention. Some of the locations where the team provided education and blood sugar screenings includes seniors centres, pharmacies, community centres, places of worship retirement homes, supermarkets and department stores.

Guest speakers from community organizations provided presentations on the topic of empowerment. Programs for Seniors:

Let's Dance - The "Let's Dance" program has been created for older adults of any ability and dance experience. This program offers a mixture of dance forms, dancing without partners, and emphasis on injury prevention. Classes are led by a York University dance instructor and consist of elements from tap, jazz, ballet, modern/contemporary, folk and world dances.

Taking it Easy-Yoga and Meditation for Older Adults-Elspeth Heyworth Centre for Women and VCHC offer free yoga and meditation sessions for adults 55+ years of age. Yoga and meditation is a wonderful way to maintain health and wellness in your busy life. Participants experience complete relaxation, a boost in energy and improvement in flexibility.



Programs for Adults:

Conquering Anxiety - 12 week support group to learn more about understanding anxiety, identifying thoughts associated with it, recognizing anxiety triggers, and developing new strategies of overcoming anxiety.

Financial Literacy Programs - These programs are designed to provide clients with basic financial literacy skills. Topics explored include budgeting, saving, banking, credit and credit cards, debt and financial woes, exploring credit bureaus, and investing basics.



Programs for Children & Youth:

Ready for Success Tutoring held at Maple High School and Joseph A. Gibson Public School –

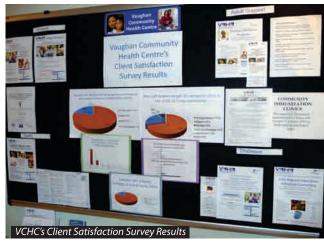
This tutoring program provides students who are struggling academically with access to free tutoring in order to help them improve their grades. This program indirectly increases students' self-esteem as they improve their academic marks.

Red Cross Babysitters Training - This is a free training program that provides youth with an opportunity to develop skills and knowledge about child development, food/nutrition and basic first aid. Youth learn how to run a babysitting business, meet new friends, and receive a babysitter's certificate.

Programs for Young Families:

Childminding Training - The purpose of the program is to train participants on how to deliver group childcare. Topics include child development, nutrition and program planning.

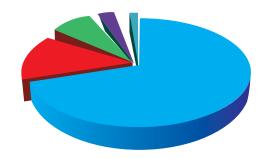

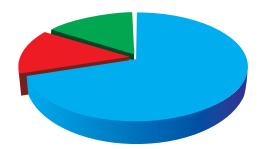
